
II. Solution cont.: Providers



- Click Reduction on all Provider notes
- 2. Family Profile & Health- build drop downs only if there are changes from previous visit
- Review of Systems- using NoteWriter macros saves clicks
- 4. Physical Exam- using PE macros saves clicks
- Assessment & Plan- fewer drop downs
- Fewer "hard stop" drop downs










Documentation Time Per Visit











